
Since my last update alot has happened. So let's crack on.

Talking of their Mum's, we are doing a new initiative once a week with a different class (so once a month



per class!) and their Mum's. It's usually about whatever is the theme of the week, which could be a parable, or about creation or characteristics of God! It's to include the Mum's in their child's day. They usually hear the story n then do an activity together. It's going really well. It's only for about 45mins, at the start of either the morning or the afternoon, but they all seem to be enjoying it!

This second term back in the pool it seems that particularly with the 5-7 year olds they are "getting" the idea of swimming! Since we started back in August I already have 6 new swimmers and several others who are nearly there! Others are really facing fears and overcoming them, re getting in the big pool! It's sooo awesome to see and it's a real privilege to be a part of something like this!
